We offer several different types of camp for your girl.

Day Camp: 2010 Theme “Forest, Fields and Fairies”

A volunteer run camp within your service unit, Day Camp is an opportunity for your girl to experience camping for the first time. Camp days range from 3 to 5 days in your local community. It is a great way for girls to experience the out of doors, cook over a fire and learn what outdoor camping is all about. Younger girls will have a great time learning about the outdoors and older girls have the opportunity to put their Program Aid Training into action. Information about communities hosting Day Camp will be available this spring.
